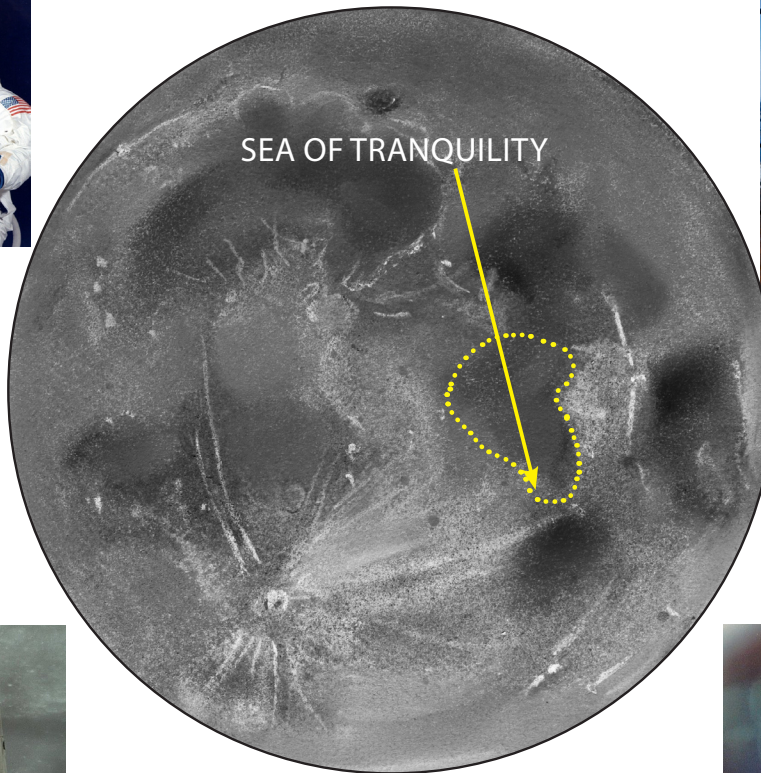

111 meters (363 feet) tall.

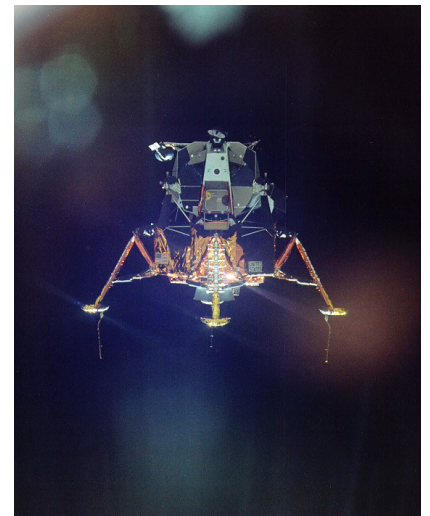

TO THE MOON AND BACK - TIMELINE

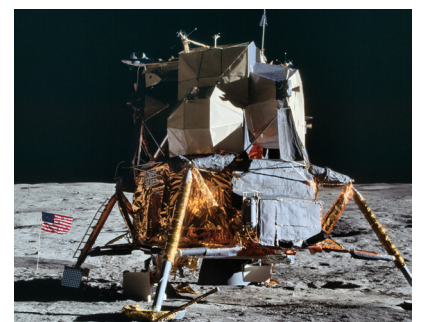
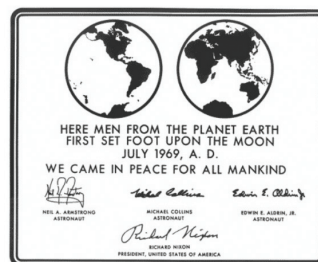
Liftoff Apollo 11, July 16, 1969, 9:32 a.m. EDT (14:32 Irish time).

Lunar Landing, July 20, 1969 4:18 a.m. EDT (21:18 Irish time).

Man Steps on the Moon, 10:56 p.m. EDT (03:56 Irish time).

Splashdown, July 24, 1969, 12:49 a.m. EDT (05:49 Irish time).

Time Armstrong and Aldrin spent on the Moon - 21 Hours and 36 minutes.
